You email instructors or clinical coordinators and they get back to you weeks later or not at all.

I feel as though some of the professors are rude and unkind and genuinely don't want students to succeed and it's frustrating

The courses are extremely unorganized. The process of finding clinical placement is not helpful. The professors pre-recorded lectures are not good quality or engaging. The communication between professors and students are very poor and it also seems that their communication among each other are poor as well.

In several classes the material is unorganized, assignments and reading unrealistic with no direction, it is impossible to know everything without being given any direction of what is important to know. Often the syllabus doesn't match the calendar which doesn't match orientation so no one knows correct due dates or anything.
