F. 4. Access to resources and opportunities is equivalent regardless of student location and teaching modalities.

As an online program all students are provided with the same access to campus resources both in face-to-face or remote forms. All students have equal access.

Students who enter the program are required to come to campus for orientation. During this face to face orientation students are provided detailed information about how to access all of the resources that are available to them as students. Updates and/or changes are communicated to students via their bobcats email and are posted in the Nightingale Café MSN. Assistance with writing is available through the Writing Center – virtual or online appointments are available. Ina Dillard Russell Library is fully accessible for online students. During orientation, students are assisted in setting up their library account and are provided information about how to contact a librarian for assistance with their course work or research.
